Racing News Andy Norton, Race Fleet Captain, Seabiscuit Tyson Geldseth, Assistant Race Fleet Captain, Quantum Leap Michael Hamilton, Past Race Fleet Captain, Amidala



Michael Hamilton has left the Three Tree Point race program in excellent shape, and I will need all of your input, advice, and help to get us through the year. The first race of this South Sound Sailing (SSS) Winter Series is the **Winter Vashon Island Race** sponsored by the Tacoma Yacht Club, and is scheduled for December 6th, 2025. TTPYC racers usually are well represented, and most of you know the current will be against you going North up Colvos Passage and the wind is, well, unpredictable. Registration for this race is already open via REGATTA Network. From my experience, getting to the start line is a lot easier if you bring your boat to Point Defiance the night before. Let's all get out there!

The next race of the series is our own **Duwamish Head spectacular**, which will occur on January 3rd 2026 out of Des Moines Marina. The race starts (09:25 first start) just off our Des Moines Marina Pier and proceeds north past Three Tree Point, then past Alki Beach to round the Duwamish Head crib, then westward around Blakely Rock and returns southward to finish at the Des Moines pier finish line.

This year we are encountering some Duwamish Head planning complications. For example, there seems to be a deficit of guest moorage for our racers coming from out of town. Additionally, handling ORC boats might be a little tricky. As always, Duwamish Head requires significant volunteer effort both for staffing the race committee and social tasks, you will be hearing more about that. I can't tell you how much all of the racers appreciate the volunteers.
