It's hard to believe that this is my last Barnacle entry as Commodore of Three Tree Point Yacht Club. It's been a fun year.

Ingrid and I hosted two cruises: the Blake Island Crab Feed and the 4th of July Commodore's Cruise in Port Gamble Bay. We



helped with breakfast at the Duwamish Head race (and got a cool T-shirt) and we put on a program at Angelo's about our kayaking in the Queen Charlotte Islands. We enjoyed participating in the Tacoma cruise put on by Vicki and Jim Carey. Even though it was pouring rain the Carey's know how to throw a good party.

Our personal cruise this year included the San Juan and Gulf Islands as well as sailing to Vancouver from Silva Bay, BC and spending two nights with the Vancouver Rowing Club in Stanley Park. We picked up our Scottish friends in Vancouver who flew in from Inverness and we all sailed up the Sunshine Coast as far as Pender Harbour before going back to Nanaimo and dropping our friends off there. We missed our yearly trip to Victoria due to high winds in Haro Straits.

While tied up in Port Madison on Bainbridge Island on the way home, Ingrid fainted from low blood pressure and fell, hitting her head. It was frightening to me to see her unconscious for 3 full minutes. She had to be taken to the emergency room for a CAT scan and sutures (staples). She did well but we lost quite a bit of confidence about two feeble old people being on the foredeck in high seas.

We decided to sell our boat after using it for 9 years and having over 600 days aboard with 10,000 nautical miles under her keel. Ingrid and I have sailed together for over 50 years, from a 19' Lightning to a 37' Tartan and we hope we haven't sailed our last trip.

Ingrid is now considering neurosurgery for her Parkinson's disease. No guarantee but there is reason to be hopeful as outcomes can be good.

It is commonly said that the two best days of boating are the day you bought your boat and the day you sold your boat. We were fortunate to get a very good broker who had a full price offer within three weeks of the boat going up for sale. He took care of all the details making it relatively painless. Still it was difficult to let it go because we know so much about that boat and have had so many thrilling and beautiful adventures together. (A tear or two by Ingrid.)

On September 6, the City's consultant presented their recommendations for development on the Marina floor to the City Council. The presentation can be found

at http://www.desmoinesmail.com/WebPDF/Council/Packet Archive/2018/090618.pdf starting on page 15. As a result, there are City Council decisions in the near term followed by changes which will be coming soon. The following message from DMMA President Ken Rogers is being shared across the boating community.

"DMMA members and all marina tenants are encouraged to attend the next DMMA fall general meeting on October 17, 7pm, at the Des Moines Activity/Senior Center. Development plans are underway for the marina basin. The future of the marina area, as well as the configuration of moorage and associated facilities, will be impacted by this process. It is important to have the boating community weigh in with their thoughts and priorities so they may be considered in the overall plan analysis. By actively participating early in the process, boaters will have a much better opportunity to influence these plans than after the fact. Now is the time to get involved, if only by becoming more informed. Input is most effective in the planning stage of this kind of a project - not once critical decisions have already been made. Please make an effort to attend the meeting and encourage your dock mates to do so as well. More members make for a more impactful voice. Thank you." *Ken Rogers*
