



TTPYC Arabella's Cruise April 11-13, 2025

We are making plans for another fun and peaceful cruise to Arabella's Landing in beautiful downtown Gig Harbor. Gig Harbor is a wonderful little town with many fun restaurants, Pubs and shops. There is a gas grill that we will have access to as well as the



Net Shed that we have reserved for dinner on Saturday evening. Even if you can't manage to attend by boat, PLEASE consider joining us on Saturday for the afternoon and evening activities. If you would like to attend any of the festivities arriving by land yacht, please send us a text and let us know the number of attendees and your arrival time.

After arrival and settling in on **Friday** afternoon we will gather on dock (**4:00 PM**) for some warming refreshments and a social hour with snacks and appetizers. We will then head off to town to sample some brew pups and some of the local eating establishments on your own.

On Saturday we invite you to check out some of the incredible pastry and coffee shops or the great breakfast options right along the waterfront. At 1:00 PM we will gather on the Net Shed patio and do a shotgun start scavenger hunt that will also be a good opportunity for a hike while engaging your brain. The "Hunt" will take about 90 minutes and along the way you'll be collecting bits of Gig Harbor Trivia and local historical lore. We will then regather at 7 Seas Brew Pub at 2:30 PM for a debrief and toast to maritime history of this quaint little town. At 5:00 PM we will open the Net Shed and enjoy a Hot Meal with side dishes brought by the membership. Details to follow.

On Sunday we plan in having a pancake grill on the dock and we will have coffee, sweet rolls, yogurt and hot pancakes with all the fix 'ins starting at 8:00 - 9:00 AM.

We have reserved 10 slips for the weekend. Each participant must make their own reservation using the instructions provided below:

- 1. Go to Arabella's Landing Marina website www.arabellaslanding.com
- 2. Select the red Book Reservation button partway down the page.
- 3. Enter the dates (Apr 11 to Apr 13)
- 4. Enter this Event Code: ttpycapr2025
- 5. Select "Search for availability"
- 6. You can view slips held for TTPYC, but not yet reserved by another participant.
 - a. These slips will be held for the club until 5 days before the scheduled arrival date on Friday, April 11, after which time they become available to the general public. Club participants may continue to reserve slips without using the event code, if slips are still available.
- 7. When reservation is complete, you will receive a confirmation email noting:
 - a. Payment: 100% of moorage cost is due at time of booking.
 - b. Cancellations: Must cancel by the date in the slip confirmation email to receive a refund for the entirety of the reservation period, less \$10.00 processing fee.
 - c. Additional information regarding: Door codes for Marina's main gate, restrooms and showers, and WiFi access details.
