

This year we had 1 boat (Hobbes) that attended all 5 cruises and 7 boats that attended 4 of the 5 cruises, (Brigadoon, Frolic, Gadget, Joyce Marie, Maypril June, Pendragon and Saga). We had Pipé attend their first ever cruise.


