Dockton pier suffered damage over the winter and it is uncertain when the docks will be repaired.

After an unusually harsh winter with multiple freeze-thaw cycles, the dock has deteriorated beyond King County Parks' capacity to make repairs that could keep it functioning.

In order to protect public safety, we have closed the dock. A small area of the dock will remain open for day-use only (at no fee), which will allow boaters to get onto land and access the rest of the park.

Although we had been planning for a dock improvement project slated to begin this summer, we did not anticipate this scale of deterioration. We are exploring all options for getting the dock back up and functioning safely, but the dock will remain closed until further notice.

The rest of the park is operational, and the restrooms will be available starting at the end of March.


I picked up the crab in Tacoma on Friday morning, then we left the dock shortly before noon, flat water and no wind, and had an uneventful motor to Blake (a good thing). With the lines secured (thanks to TTPYC dockhands) and the crab in the racoon proof can, we took advantage of the beach and enjoyed the views of Seattle.

The Club rented the Point shelter Friday and Saturday. Cruisers hastily cobbled appetizers for sharing at the Friday evening happy hour. Introductions were made and the Schedule of Events for Saturday shared. We enjoyed the company, views and fire in the shelter. Several guests on board included Kylee, Kadyn and Zion on Prime Meridian, Etta and Jeff on Brigadoon, and Guy A. on Equus, and Jim C singlehanded to Blake on Stella Maris.

Cruisers gathered at the Point shelter Saturday for an afternoon of games. We began by selecting teams for the "R *Eggs* lay". Teams had to select an egg, place it on a wooden spoon, then run/walk the course from the volleyball court, around the picnic table and back, handing off the egg and spoon to the next relayer. No touching of the egg(s) allowed unless to pick it up from the ground and handing off. We had 4 teams, all competed in the first heat, the first and second teams advanced to the Final. Team 1- Janis, Jim C, Don, Steve, Frank, Etta and Tammy; Team 2-Jean, Sharon, Janet, Kristie, Tish, Sandy and Merch; Team 3-Debra, Dean, Sunni, Jeff, Kylie and Tom (Jeff had to run twice because Team 3 was short a person); and Team 4-Doug, Lesley, Zion, Ray, Chris, Shelley and Buzz. Keeping the eggs on the wooden spoons was tricky, there were some unusual striding techniques used, extreme concentration led some to veer slightly off course, and near collisions were avoided at the turn around the picnic table! Team 4 won the first heat, and Team 3 was second. There was some controversy over the **PINK EGG**, the egg selected by Team 4, so Team 3 used the **PINK EGG** for the Final Relay. Team 3 took the Final Relay, though most agreed that the **PINK EGG** contributed to both team's wins.
