Hopefully it is an indicator of a good cruising season.. Our traditional September cruise has been moved from Dockton to the Brownville marina. Dockton pier suffered damage over the winter and it is uncertain when the docks will be repaired.



## Dock at Dockton Park closed

### Small portion of pier available for day-use only (no fee)

After an unusually harsh winter with multiple freeze-thaw cycles, the dock has deteriorated beyond King County Parks' capacity to make repairs that could keep it functioning.

In order to protect public safety, we have closed the dock. A small area of the dock will remain open for day-use only (at no fee), which will allow boaters to get onto land and access the rest of the park.

Although we had been planning for a dock improvement project slated to begin this summer, we did not anticipate this scale of deterioration. We are exploring all options for getting the dock back up and functioning safely, but the dock will remain closed until further notice.

The rest of the park is operational, and the restrooms will be available starting at the end of March.
