Racing News Dean Conti, Race Fleet Captain Duane Rubash, Assistant Race Fleet Captain



Once again, the weather Gods smiled upon us

so we could have another successful TTPYC Duwamish Race! The wind forecast was 0-4 knots dropping to 0-2 knots so I was worried we might not be able to even start. Fortunately, dawn arrived mostly clear and enough breeze to get the fleet of 51 registered boats started on time. Steve and his crew did a perfect job, we can't thank them enough.

Like Winter Vashon another beautiful day on the water with no rain. There were periods of no wind though we also saw a (momentary) gust of 10 knots! Wow! The fleet worked its way north up the sound chasing the light zephyrs across the water. After the turn to the east after Alki Point the wind backed out and it became a big challenge to keep the boat moving. Many boats (including Equus) ended up doing 360 spins in the current. In the end the final few miles from Alki Point to Duwamish Head were painfully slow but the majority of the fleet prevailed. Happily, Carol, Sonny and Chris Jones were patiently waiting at the Duwamish Head shorten course mark aboard Brigadoon to bring the race to a close.

As usual it is the dedication of the volunteers and the participants that make our club events successful. Be sure to get out on the water soon!

Vendee Globe Race: solo, non-stop, no assistance around the world.

After an amazing 80 days at sea and covering 24K+ miles the fleet began finishing this week in France. Typically, there is a clear leader as they near the finish and the boats are spread out over a large distance. This year the first eight places finished within 19 hours. Since three of these boats were to receive redress due to their loosing time searching for the skipper who had to abandon his boat, the final results weren't known until all the exact finish times were known.

Of the 33 boats that started eight so far had to abandon due to equipment failure (or boat sinking). As an average this is a little lower than previous versions. One skipper, Sam Davies from the UK, stopped at Cape Horn, repaired her boat and then restarted. She is no longer in the race since she received assistance, but for her just finishing her adventure is just as important. BTW of the six women that started the race, four are still competing.

As you are all probably aware the USA boat Patriot had a significant mishap while trying to perform a difficult mark rounding maneuver. A couple small errors combined with a



doubling of the wind velocity in a gust at exactly the wrong moment launched the boat bow 20-30 feet in the air and then it crashing down on the water. A large area of the hull failed as that location typically doesn't even touch water, so it was not designed to handle any significant load. The boat laid over on its side but was quickly righted by a chase boat using a process that they have perfected. Unknown at the time there was a big hole and the boat almost sank. There is great video and commentary available on YouTube.

Team USA was forced to sit out the next series to repair the boat. Lots of carbon fiber plus all the electronics and wiring since everything was under salt water. Immense effort to get back out on the water with only a week's time available. They are now racing against the Italian Prada boat for the final slot to advance to the next stage. A big challenge for them with time lost.

Regardless of who advances there will continue to be amazing racing in New Zeeland with great coverage so stayed tuned!
