Another Sailing Cruising Adventure



A new start-up in town is Seattlesailingship.com and their ship Bay Lady. They offer two hour cruises around Elliot Bay up to three times daily from Bell Harbor Marina. She is a two masted gaff rig schooner that the new owner Noah Waldman purchased in California and brought north this June. Measuring 85' long, 20' beam, 88' tall mast and 34 ton displacement, she is very stable. I have been training with them for the

past two weeks and I will be working as Captain on a part time basis. She is a lot of fun to sail, both for the crew and guests.

She follows the historic American schooner design as a cargo hauler except the cargo hold is now raised and filled with open bench seating. She has lots of railing space and both ends for comfortable viewing. We had 40 guests on board last week and there was still plenty of room. She holds a Certificate of Inspection from the USCG and is approved for up to 86 paying passengers.

New Member Introductions

One of the pleasures of being membership chair is the privilege to interview new members and introduce them to the membership.

DWIGHT and CHRISTA MOTZ (pronounced Moats)

Dwight and Christa are retirees, "Living the Dream"; he from being an Alaska Airlines pilot, and she is a retired RN. They live in Covington, and moor their boat in Des Moines, slip #D45.

Dwight was raised around boating, as his father was a racer and builder of small boats. He was his father's crew member when he was 9 or 10, doing small dinghy racing. They also raced Hobie Cats on Lake Michigan. His Dad had wished for a 30' boat in his retirement but had been vetoed by his mom.

Christa enthusiastically supported purchasing their boat. They bought their Sun Odyssey 410 new in Anacortes, and brought her South in November 2019, pre-pandemic, coming through the Swinomish Channel in tremendous fog, with 1/8 mile visibility. Since Dwight had a pilot background, he knew how to rely on his electronics (several different types) to guide him. They named her Frolic, after a boat Dwight's Dad build long ago, a mahogany Thistle 17' sailboat, also named Frolic. They first moored at Tyee Marina, and then after a wait list of 5-6 month, were able to move to the Des Moines Marina.

They have had several San Juan trips this summer, but long to sail up to Ketchikan someday. His airline experiences endeared him to Alaska. They missed the Kingston meet up because they took their daughter, her husband, and 18-month-old granddaughter up into the Islands. The grandchild was in a lifejacket, with about a 6' tether on her. She really enjoyed the view from the bow. In addition, the family has two Irish terriers that accompany them - not yet big fans of the water but managing boat life OK. The Motz's have three adult kids, two of whom live in the area.

We chatted about the club, the meetings, and the social gatherings, and they are considering attending the September Blake Island crab feed. We look forward to when we can meet in person.
