### Racíng News Dean Contí, Race Fleet Captaín Duane Rubash, Assístant Race Fleet Captaín

February saw the completion of the three race Harbor Series run by CYC Tacoma. TTPYC joined forces with CYCT to help keep the fleet participation numbers up. Our club boats that competed in some or all of the races:

Cherokee Equus Hobbs Miss Mayhem Slick Congratulations to Slick with Christine Nelson/Paul Grove and Miss Mayhem with Melissa Davies for placing first in their respective (and only two) classes!





The third race of the Southern Sound Series was run out of Olympia Yacht Club. The course starts mid Budd Inlet, wanders north around the Toliva Shoal buoy and returns to Budd Inlet, leaving Anderson Island and the buoy to port. This is the longest of the four races at 38.4 nm. It was a fast race with wind gusts in the mid 30 knots and the fleet finishing in the daylight. On Equus, for the second time in three years, we ran almost the entire race with no main. This time the damage was (limited?) to a torn main sail.

Four TTPYC boats made the trip and did well.

With these overall results the TTPYC team of Nimbus/Cherokee/Equus extended our first-place lead, now standing at 34 points over second place. The final race is March 14<sup>th</sup> sponsored by Gig Harbor Yacht Club.

Tom Hubbard continues to prepare for his participation in the Clipper Round the World Race. He will be on the Seattle boat for the leg that starts in Seattle, goes through the Panama Canal, and finishes in New York City. Due to the Corona virus issues, the planned stops in China have been changed to the Philippines. The arrival of the fleet in Seattle from the Philippines is still estimated for the third week of March. You should try to visit the fleet while it is at Bell Harbor. It's definitely exciting and you can get a tour of one of the boats. They are probably much different than anything you've been on before.


To get or share important club-related news, use our Facebook account. And be sure and check regularly for updates between Barnacles.
