Will your boat survive the tsunami that follows the next earthquake? Find out by joining the January 12^{th} zoom meeting.

Title: Understanding Pacific Northwest Earthquake and Tsunami Risks

Topics: Fundamental geology of earthquakes; the three very different types of earthquakes and associated risks of each; personal Preparedness

Why: The science of Pacific Northwest earthquakes has progressed significantly in recent years. Understanding the various risks and being prepared can be of great benefit to all of us.

Racing News Dean Conti, Race Fleet Captain Duane Rubash, Assistant Race Fleet Captain

January begins with the TTPYC Duwamish Head race on Saturday the 9th. The starts begin at 9:30am off



the end of the fishing pier. The thirty-mile course goes from Des Moines, rounding the Duwamish Head light leaving it to port, then west to round the Blakely Rocks leaving it to port and back to finish at Des Moines. The time limit is 30 hours for the full race though it drops to 13 hours if the course needs to be shortened at Duwamish Head due to light winds. Besides the normal race boat classes there are cruising classes, both spinnaker and non-spinnaker. That allows any boat to come out and participate. This year single handed and double handed classes were added so skippers could decide to go out without having too many people on their boats.

Friday night we normally have a crew at the dock to meet the arriving boats to direct parking and to offer food and drinks. Unfortunately, with the pandemic we will have a very limited presence. I will be down there starting at 4PM, let me know if you want to help.

Steve Sisson will be running the race from the end of the fishing pier. He has been putting together a crew and you can him at 206-218-8138 if you want to help.

As you are probably aware TTPYC owns and maintains a series of permanent race markers around Des Moines area. They are all included on the official paper and electronic charts. For some inexplicable reason, over the past 15 months we have had six failures, only one mark remains. (Usually there is one failure every year or other year. What did I do to deserve this to happen during my watch???) The final one was rescued two weeks ago just outside of the breakwater. Once we get past our Duwamish Head race, we will start the process of repair, assembly and launching, unfortunately a big job. I'll put out a call for volunteers when the time arrives.

Vendee Globe Race: solo, non-stop, no assistance around the world.

My December report ended with the news that one of the race boats sank with the skipper abandoning the boat for his life raft. Four of the race boats stopped racing to start searching since they are the only boats in that section of the Southern Ocean. Fortunately, he was found within 16 hours (in the dark), though the transfer from the life raft was delayed a few hours due to the extremely rough sea state. To understand how difficult this race is, many more people have climbed Mt Everest than have completed this circumnavigation. The current race leaders are passing point Nemo in the southern Pacific, which is the location farthest from all points of land. If you go to the Marine Traffic web site:

you can see how few boats are down there. The race fleet represents the majority of all boats in the Southern Pacific.

The 36th America's Cup preliminary racing started and ran from December 16th through 19th. From these early results it appears that teams New Zealand and American Magic have an initial advantage. The boats are large and fast and are difficult to control. Lots of good video on YouTube. Development continues on all the boats with racing to resume on January 15th and run through February 22nd. The final series for the Cup are in March.
