

An Update from Recreational Boat Association of Washington

Hello Three Tree Point Yacht Club,

We are so grateful to have your club as a valued member of RBAW. Thank you for your club's 100% individual member participation. With your generous support we have been able to continue our hard work, making an impact in the areas that mean the most to Washington boaters:

• SAFETY & AWARENESS: We identified the need for boater awareness of the seaplane advisory buoys on Lake Union each summer and worked with state agencies to create the #MindTheZone campaign funded in the 2022 state budget. You might have seen the coverage on KOMO News or King 5!

- FINANCIAL OVERSIGHT: We are currently spending time in Olympia challenging the Department of Revenue's Depreciation Schedule used to calculate fair market value of vessels which is then used to calculate your annual watercraft excise taxes.

BEING PREPARED ON THE WATER

We had a tragedy in our family not too long ago and I wanted to share with my boating family some lessons learned and some steps to take so you can be more prepared to be proactive in maybe saving someone's life.

I lost my 74-year-old brother to a heart attack not long ago and one of the biggest issues why he did not survive had to do with the length of time that elapsed between his cardiac event and his receiving lifesaving assistance. Unfortunately, loved ones that were nearby were not able to administer CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation), nor was an AED

(Automated External Defibrillator) available until paramedics arrived at the scene some 20 minutes after his heart attack. After their arrival on site, Paramedics were able to reestablish a heartbeat but because his brain had been deprived of oxygen for such a long period of time, he suffered severe brain damage that stood in the way of his recovery.

There are two essential elements to aiding a person experiencing a cardiac event. The first is CPR and the second is the availability of an AED. As has been so vividly demonstrated by the events that occurred at the Bengals/Buffalo Bills game in January, Damar Hamlin is alive and recovering because he received timely lifesaving treatment literally seconds after his coronary event. The timing of receiving treatment is <u>so</u> critical in these instances.

We who experience the joy and beauty of a day on our boats on Puget Sound are particularly vulnerable if sudden cardiac event occurred while underway. While afloat, the time it will take for trained medical aid to arrive at your boat could be measured in hours and not minutes. You cannot be dependent on external help being there, you must act now to ensure that you and/or your crew has the best chance to see another day on the water. It is for this reason that every single one of us should be trained in CPR/AED lifesaving steps and why each of our boats (and homes when were not on the water) should be equipped with what are now very reasonably priced and durable AED units.

CPR/AED and first aid courses are so easy to complete these days. Quality certified courses are offered through NationalCPRfoundation.com. There are three sections to the course, and each can be completed in 15-20 minutes with a 10-question test at the end of each course. The courses can even be completed on your cell phone! At the successful completion of the course, you will receive a certification card that is good for two years.

Now for the hard part. We have researched most of the portable AED's on the market and we have decided to purchase the Physio Control LIFEPAK CR2 portable defibrillator for our own use. We believe that this unit gives the best value and reliability in today's market.

Modern AED units really are incredible. After two pads are attached to the patient, the machine prompts CPR actions and then analyses the patient's heart rhythm and

determines if a shock is necessary. The fully automatic version initiates the shock by itself (after a verbal warning). The semi-automatic requires that the attendant initiate the shock after determining that the patient is clear.

This package includes everything you need to be prepared for an unexpected coronary event while on the water (or at Home). The unit comes with a soft sided carrying case and includes a storage cabinet that you can mount in the cabin of your boat and use while underway and then take the unit home with you when you not on the boat. (See the complete features page.)

Through a preferred customer pricing program, we are purchasing the semi-automatic version with the case for \$1,699.00. This includes all the items on the attached features brochure and a soft case that would protect the unit in transport to and from the boat. The price also includes free shipping and no sales tax charge. Additional, if our order totals 15 or more we will receive and additional discount.

Tacoma Mountaineers Basic Crewing/Sailing Course Registration opens Feb 6th

Learn the skills to be a welcome member of the crew on a friend's sailboat! This course will cover the knowledge needed to feel comfortable stepping aboard a sailboat and contributing to the fun of sailing the boat on the Salish Sea. We will cover: basic crewing skills, names for all the stuff onboard,

basic sail trim, points of sail, staying safe while on a sailboat, what to wear and even learn some useful knots.

This course consists of three classroom sessions and four on the water sessions, one at the dock and 3 out sailing in the Tacoma Area. The classroom sessions will be Monday, April 3rd, Monday, April 10th and Monday, April 17th. They will be held at the Tacoma Mountaineer's Program Center, from 6:30 to 8:30 pm.

The dockside session be held on Saturday April 8th at 10am at the Foss Waterway Public Dock.

Students will pick the various scheduled sails based on what are most convenient for them.

Our lessons our based on the textbook Sailing Made Easy, by the American Sailing Association. Note - This is not an ASA sponsored course, and those who complete it will **not** earn their ASA 101 certification.

Cost of the course is \$150 for Mountaineer members, \$175 for non-members. This does not include the cost of the text book.
