Racing News Duane Rubash Race Fleet Captain Dwight Motz, Assistant Race Fleet Captain

Equus represented well in the <u>PNW Offshore</u> as 3rd in class and 10th overall. They are also in Victoria currently participating in <u>Swiftsure</u>, the results should be in by the time this article is published. Check the website.

Dean and Shelley on Equus shared two major highlights of the PNW Offshore Race::



1) Sailing downwind in the dark with 25-30 knots wind with the 1900 square foot spinnaker up and surfing up to 18 knots.

2) Just before dark with the same conditions as above and moving at 12 knots, a Humpback whale surfaced directly in front of us at 50 feet going the opposite direction. We had just enough time to turn left, missed each other no more than 20 feet. Don't want to think what could have happened in a head on

collision with a combined closing speed of 15-20 knots.

We have one more race to finish out our Late Spring Series on June 2nd then on to our Early Summer Series starting June 9th. We have a few more slots to be filled for Race Committee Boat for the Late Summer Series; July 7th, July 21st, and July 28th if you can volunteer let Dwight or myself know.

Chris Caudill, Dwight Motz and I have been working on some revised language to incorporate into our race handbook to encourage participation as Race Committee and not

penalize or skew results. Once we settle on the best language, we will update the results starting with the early spring this season and carry these through going forward. We currently have two proposals we are deciding upon and the main difference between the two versions is how many races a boat can be RC in a given series and receive their average score verses a fleet median score. If you have any strong feeling one way or the other on the topic let us know.

Unique to Proposal A

• A boat that completes 3 or more races in a series and serves as RC receives an average of the scored races for 1 race as RC.

Unique to Proposal B

• A boat that shows (enters the starting sequence as a racer) in 50% or more of the races in a series receives an average of the scored races in that series for the race(s) serving as RC.

Common to Proposal A & B

- For all other conditions where a boat serves as RC, they receive the median fleet score for race(s) as RC.
- Points awarded to RC receive a RC designation.
- In the event of a tie, boats with more scored races will be awarded position.

Clipper Standings

The Seattle boat is currently in 10^{th} place and currently motoring to get fuel before transiting the Panama Canal, the next leg Panama to Bermuda is scheduled to start June 2^{nd} , so by the time this article is publishes they should have



already transited the Panama Canal and getting ready to start racing again.

Tom is in Panama. He is posting on the TTPYC Facebook account. Be sure to follow us.

representatives. At the end of the day, we Ubered back to Bell Harbor for a wonderful potluck meal with our TTPYC friends.




Samantha and I have noticed that it seems like we are hearing a lot about covid lately..... We want to be sure all our TTPYC
