Racing News Dean Conti, Race Fleet Captain Duane Rubash, Assistant Race Fleet Captain



The third race of the South Sound Series was

set to happen on February 13th. Unfortunately, that coincided with the big snow storm that ended up dumping approximately 12" all over the south sound area. In response to the winter storm forecast the Olympia Yacht Club wisely cancelled the race so no one would feel compelled to drive in the expected hazardous conditions. Saturday was stormy and snowy with boat decks covered with ice so it wasn't so bad to stay home and drink cocoa by the fire.

The final two competitors in the Vendee Globe around the world race will be finishing in the next week. If they succeed that will make 25 of the 33 starters completing the course. As a percentage, the eight boats that had to abandon the race marks a lower number than historic averages. The boat builders seem to be getting better with their designs except for a couple catastrophic failures. The race is held every four years so you'll have to wait until 2024 for more excitement.

In the Americas Cup, the Italian entry Luna Rossa won the Prada Cup by beating the UK entry Grenadier 7 races to 1. That means the Cup final will match the Italians against the New Zealand boat Whakamihi with racing scheduled to start March 5^{th} . Unfortunately, there might be a delay as a new outbreak of Covid-19 in New Zealand in the past couple days has prompted a new lockdown. Stand by for news.

Member News

Elizabeth Pye Haines (Betty) was born May 26th, 1920 to Alfred W. and Mable J. Pye in Alameda, California. Her father was the Head Manager of the San Francisco office of Eastman Kodak, in charge of all company operations from the Mississippi to the Orient, 1906-1949. Betty died at her home in Des Moines, Washington on February 8th, 2021. She was predeceased by brother David (and Anne) Pye of Concord, CA and sister Margaret (and Lloyd) Apgar of Walnut Creek, CA.



Betty graduated from Piedmont High School and the University of California Berkeley. After graduation she worked for the Navy as a civilian.

Betty married Byron D. Haines November 13, 1943 at her family home in Piedmont, CA. After the war, they lived in West Seattle and Sumner where the children were raised until 1961. To be closer to Timberline Lumber Yard in SeaTac, which By co-owned, the family

moved to Des Moines, WA. Betty was a homemaker and served on the boards of Sumner's and Mt. Rainier's American Field Service which placed international exchange students into local families. For decades she volunteered in hospital libraries and cancer-support groups. Betty was an avid skier and sailor from childhood until ages 80 and 90 respectively. She was the proud captain of the "Shady Lady" and a member of the Three Tree Point Yacht Club. Betty and By were divorced in 1975. By predeceased her in 2007.

She is remembered by many as an independent woman ahead of her time. Her family remains in awe of how well she took care of herself and all she left behind.

Betty is survived by children Sally M. Haines (Charles Ream) of Ann Arbor, MI, Laurie A. Haines of Rancho Mirage, CA, and William D. Haines of Ravensdale, WA, grandchildren Sasha Lawler of Ann Arbor, Ian Lawler (Jennifer) of Prosper, TX, and Max Crystal of San Francisco, CA, great grandsons Hunter B. Lawler and Alexander E. Lawler, nephews David Stephen Pye (Shalita) of Anacortes, WA, John Apgar of Wenatchee, WA, niece Linda Bennett of Santa Cruz, CA, and numerous great nieces and nephews.

Following her wishes, her family will celebrate her life by placing her remains near the sailboat racing mark W S "I" in the Puget Sound waters in front of her home.
