Racing News Ross Chamberlain, Race Fleet Captain, Work Release Michael Hamilton, Assistant Race Fleet Captain, Amidala



My first Gig Harbor Yacht Club LeMans Race November 18 was an experience. Work Release and Blue Max represented TTPYC. The cool windless morning brought dense fog to Gig Harbor. Twenty-five racers anchored in the starting area in low visibility, and an ebbing tide.

The starting area buoys could not be seen due to the low visibility. We stern anchored in the vicinity of the rest of the fleet. It was eerie to not be able to see either shore of the



harbor. Navionics and the depth meter were prime. I sighted Chuck on Blue Max briefly during anchoring, but lost sight of him. Per the sailing instructions, we huddled down below awaiting the start signal. At the start a flurry of activity could be heard as crews weighed anchor and set sails. The low wind and reduced visibility made it a challenge to exit the harbor. Fortunately, as we approached Tides Tavern the sun came out, Chuck reappeared, and we saw a pack of onlookers cheering the fleet on.





We gybed our way out of the harbor

entrance without incident on a 10' tide. Low winds resulted in a shortened course near Camp Sealth, Vashon Island. Our crew had a good time, we'll be back next year.

The first race in the Southern Sound Series, Winter Vashon, is Dec 2. TTPYC will be well represented by boats in a variety of classes. The race starts near Tacoma Yacht Club at 9:30 with the

Large Lock Full Chamber Navigation Back in Service 11/14 - 11/29

The large locks are back in service, one day ahead of schedule. It will be open to large vessel traffic until Nov. 29. While it's back in service, please note that the center miter gates have been removed, and a temporary marine fender has been installed in the recessed where the gates where.

Please remember to:

- Exercise extreme caution while entering and exiting the large lock chamber, because the center gate recess and the surrounding (demolition) area around the center gate will be fully exposed; and
- Operate your vessels at a slow speed 2 ½ knots or lower, and follow the guidance and instructions of the Tower and lock operators.

State Parks closes 35 mooring buoys

The Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission (Parks) has identified 35 public recreational mooring buoys across western Washington that are at risk of breaking in the future.

Starting this week, Parks will close these buoys, which the agency plans to replace. Even though individual buoys will close, the impacted parks will still have other mooring buoys available for use.

Parks maintains 259 mooring buoys at 40 parks across Puget Sound, Hood Canal, the Kitsap and Olympic Peninsulas and San Juan Islands. Of these parks, 16 will be affected by partial buoy closures. They are:

- Blake Island
- Clark Island
- Cutts Island
- Fort Flagler
- Fort Townsend
- Fort Worden
- Tllahee
- Jones Island
- Kopachuck
- Mystery Bay
- Potlach
- Sequim Bay
- Stuart Island, Provost Harbor
- Stuart Island, Reid Harbor
- Sucia Island, Fox Cove and Twanoh

The agency plans to replace the existing anchors with modern helical screw-type anchors. Planners anticipate installing the new anchor systems in winter 2024 - 2025, pending permitting and funding. The 35 buoys will be closed until further notice.

When finished, the upgraded systems will allow boats to safely tie up, and they will limit impacts on eelgrass, fish, marine mammals and other fragile shallow marine environments

Multi-Year Certificate of Documentation for Recreational Vessel Owners Available

The Coast Guard is issuing a final rule for recreational vessel owners to select a recreational vessel endorsement on a Certificate of Documentation (COD) with a validity of 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 years. Currently, regulations require that a COD will be effective for a 5-year period. Congress passed, and the President signed, the self-executing National Defense Authorization Act of 2022 (2022 Act), which directs the Coast Guard to issue recreational vessel CODs for 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 years. By updating the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) to reflect this change, this final rule harmonizes the requirements of the 2022 Act, aligns CFR text with current Coast Guard policy, and provides vessel owners' statutorily directed option to select the validity period of their COD that best suits their individual needs. This final rule is effective **December 14**, 2023
