So, it's getting pretty chilly in the PNW with snow in the mountains and freezing temperatures almost every night. You would think that the Yacht club crowd would be settling back in their big easy chair and reading a good boating adventure story in front of a crackling fire while sipping some fine wine. Well I'm here to tell you even though that sounds like a pleasant way to spend our winter months, it's just the opposite of what will be going on for many of our TTPYC sailing populace.

On December 7th, Tacoma Yacht Club sponsors the first race of the Winter South Sound Series by hosting the Vashon Island race. This is a 30+ nautical mile circumnavigation of Vashon Island that frequently has boats finishing the course well after sunset as long as the wind holds

out. With a 13-hour time limit and a 09:30 start, boats frequently finish well into the darkness and need to illuminate their sail number as they cross the finish line so the race committee can register their finish.

TTPYC sponsors the second race in the South Sound Series and for sure the biggest event on our club's racing calendar. Our own Duwamish Head Race will be held on January 4th, 2025. This is definitely an "all Hands" event with lots of members volunteering to serve in a myriad of functions that are essential to putting on an exciting, competitive, safe, and well administered event. Please come join in the fun and support your club organizers when they ask you to volunteer your time and skills in support of our regatta.

No one person can run a good race series. It takes a village and with only a few weeks to go to the *Duwamish Head Race* the TTPYC village needs to assemble a consummate team of experienced professionals to committee the race OR... If we can't find those folks we will have to fill the positions with warm bodies from our ranks.



We are going to need a staff of upwards of 20 volunteers to support all the functions of the RC.

2025 Duwamish Head Support team:

Race Management: Steve Sisson Lead Race Official/Starter to run the show from the pier and Finish if race goes the distance. Michael Hamilton Principle Race Officer on the Safety Vessel to make the on-the-water decisions like shortening the course, finishing the race at the DH. AND,... A dedicated group of Spotters, Recorders, Timers, Signalers, Scorers, and Safety crew. WOW,... The end of the Des Moines Fishing Pier is getting crowded.

Club Representatives: Dean Conti, representing TTPYC to the SSS. Dwight Motz acting as Coast Guard Liaison securing the all important USCG Event Permit.

Visiting Boat Arrival Committee: Ross Chamberlain, Alan Riley, Dwight Motz. These folks organize the mooring plan and coordinate with Des Moines Marina in accommodating boats arriving the day prior to the race. They also direct the arriving boats to their moorage slips and assist when necessary in securing the boats safely at the guest dock.

Hospitality committee: Linda Stryker and her crew. These ladies have volunteered to plan and coordinate the Soup Supper on Friday night and the Breakfast Bar that will be set up on race day morning. Both these events will take place at the Activity shelter at the Des Moines Marina Guest Pier. Events are open to all regatta participants and TTPYC members.

Behind The Scenes: These folks do the gritty nuts and bolts tasks that are absolutely vital to success and they rarely receive the recognition they deserve. They are Shelly Conti, Scorer and Regatta Network guru, Brian Newman, Web support, and Tom Hubbard, artist extraordinaire, who gives our Trophies and Merchandise their style.

You would think that cast of characters could handle the task, but we still need volunteers to step-up as Spotter/Recorders. These folks get the best seat in the house to watch the race because they have to be in the middle of the action to spot and record that action. We could use a power boat to serve as the on the water RC & Safety vessel. We still have open positions on the Protest Committee and Technical Committee.
